Refer to Andy Jones' memorandum of September 9 about non-resident students and send your replies to Felix Joyner as soon as possible.

Check the policy statement on disruption to be sure you are in compliance with the committee system outlined therein.

Dick Robinson was authorized to proceed to develop, with the aid of the Deans of Student Affairs on the various campus, a policy on drugs.

I will ask Joe Eagles, Ferebee Taylor and John Wright to visit Julian Fenner to discuss with him the advance deposits required by recent legislation.

Because we have had inquiries about how merit raises are allocated, I am alerting you to expect requests for your records on this subject.

The Chapel Hill campus has received work that federal agencies expect deposits to be placed in minority banks, and a list of such banks was enclosed. Please check your own situation.

I will appoint a special group to study and clarify the situation relating to sick leave, vacation leave, state holidays and sabbaticals for 12-month employees who are exempt from the State Personnel Act.
