PRESIDENT BOWLES' REPORT BOARD OF GOVERNORS MEETING OCTOBER 12, 2007

This has been an exciting week for a lot of us. Not only did we have two of the UNC Tomorrow Listening Forums this week, but we also had the last one. It has been a full week, so I will be very brief.

It's hard for me to stand here today and not feel like we are really blessed at this

University. I think we are blessed with great and committed faculty like Dr. George Wilson and
we have to do more to attract and retain leaders like George. We are also blessed to have great
scholars like Oliver Smithies who won the Nobel Prize this week. It is the first one in the
University's history.

I am so grateful to have Senator Burr come here today and support what we are doing to try to move this University forward and to do it with a real pace because the world is rapidly changing. We are really blessed to have his kind of leadership in Washington, D.C. He could not be more helpful to us in trying to do things that move this University forward and help our students be prepared for the knowledge-based global economy. I don't think we could be more blessed to have the leadership we have in Raleigh. This is a state legislature who has stuck with this University through thick and thin. If we didn't have that support, we would not have the margins of excellence to even think about competing in a knowledge-based global economy. I don't know how you all felt, but as I went to these UNC Tomorrow Listening Forums, I felt blessed that we have people in North Carolina that really love and believe in this University. They are counting on us to do the right thing to take this University forward so we are prepared to get their kids the skills and education they need to compete in a knowledge-based global economy.

When I listened to Chancellor Moeser announce his retirement last week I thought about what he has done as a leader and the demands he has made for excellence at UNC Chapel Hill. The evidence is there. It's in the diversity and quality of the student body, it's in the quality of the faculty, it's in the facilities, in the scholarships, and in the Carolina Covenant. Mr. Chairman, I would like to second that recommendation. There are few people who have given up more than Dick Spangler did to serve as president of this University for 11 years. He has given this University so much and yet you can't find his name anywhere because that's

what he wanted. We could have hundreds of buildings on every campus named for Dick Spangler. However, do you know what he cares about? He cares about this greater University and all of the campuses. I think it is so appropriate that we honor him for the great public service he has given by naming these buildings in honor of President *Emeritus* C.D. Spangler, Jr. I make that recommendation to you Mr. Chairman.
