REMARKS OF DR. PHILIP L. DUBOIS BOG MEETING MARCH 18, 2005

Well, it's been many years since I've been in this room. It's good to be home. Chairman Wilson, members of the Board of Governors, President Broad, Mr. Bissell and members of the Search Committee, ladies and gentlemen, Lisa and I are very excited to return to Charlotte with the tremendous opportunity you have given us to lead UNC Charlotte and to serve the people of North Carolina.
