REMARKS BY DR. KYLE R. CARTER CHANCELLOR-ELECT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA AT PEMBROKE

Dr. Carter exclaimed this was a glorious day for him and his family. He said he was absolutely thrilled by this appointment. He thanked the Board of Governors and President Bowles for giving him the opportunity to lead and to serve UNC Pembroke.

During the course of the search process, Dr. Carter said that he had met many outstanding individuals whose passion was only exceeded by their work ethic. He noted that Dr. Freda Porter, UNCP alumna and Chair of the Board of Trustees and the Search Committee, embodies the institution's success story.
