EXCERPTS OF DR. DAVID O. BELCHER'S REMARKS CHANCELLOR–ELECT OF WESTERN CAROLINA UNIVERSITY April 8, 2011

Dr. Belcher thanked the members of the Board of Governors, President Ross, Board of Trustee Chair Warren, other members of the Board of Trustees, Chancellor Bardo, and all the Western Carolina University community, for this exciting opportunity.
