

### State Appropriations & Tuition & Fees

#### General Uses – State Appropriations & Tuition:

 Core instructional, academic support and associated administrative services (includes faculty and staff salaries, library operations, academic advisors, campus safety, information technology, budget and human resources personnel)

#### Limitations:

 Not allowed to support health centers, student activities, dining facilities, parking decks, athletics, or residence halls

#### <u>General Uses – Fees</u>:

• Supports specific activities for which students are paying

#### Limitations:



• Must be used for the purpose for which it was established

### Total UNC Revenues Auxiliaries

#### General Uses:

- Revenues generated by auxiliary enterprise operations of the institution exist to provide services to the students, faculty, or staff
- Auxiliary enterprises are managed as selfsupporting activities (includes residence halls, bookstores, food services, student health services, mail centers, and student unions)

### Limitations:

• Must directly support the operation of the associated activities

# Total UNC Revenues

### Federal Appropriations, Contracts & Grants

### <u>General Uses</u>:

- Debt service on research facilities, research portion of faculty salaries, research personnel and graduate student workers for the project
- Includes Pell grants and other forms of federal financial aid for students

#### Limitations:

- Restricted by the federal government and monitored for compliance
- Funds cannot be legally diverted for purposes not central to the research mission

• Endowment dollars are typically restricted by the donor and non-transferable to other uses, unless expressly allowed







### **Trends in UNC GF Support** Fixed Cost Changes from 2008-09 to 2012-13

- Fixed costs for utilities have increased by \$14M
- Cost of retirement and healthcare benefits have increased almost \$200M
- 1.2% compensation increases total \$32M
