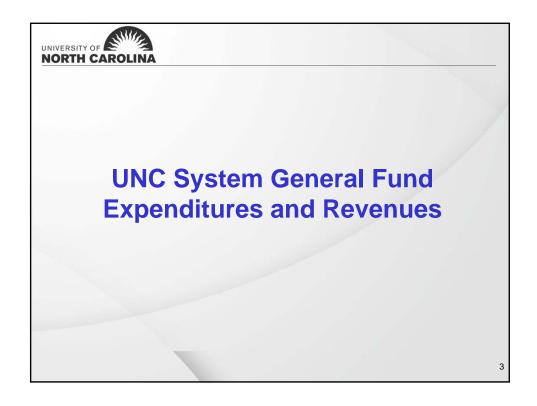


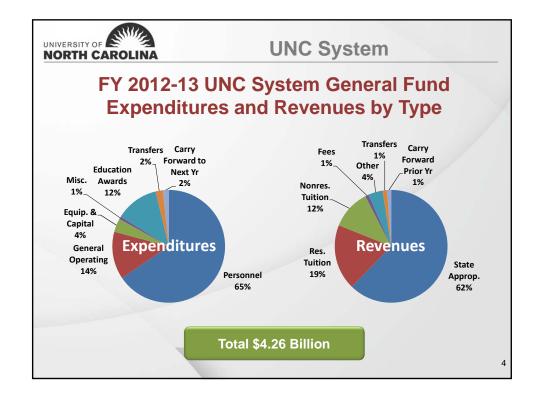

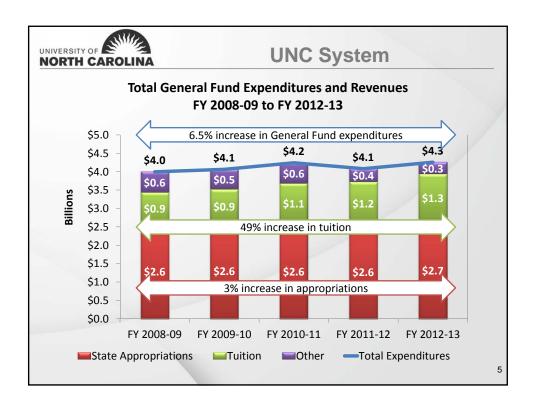

#### **UNC System**

#### **Fixed Costs and Inflation**

- Between FY 2008-09 and FY 2012-13, fixed personnel costs changes would have increased the personnel budget by 5.25%.
  - Actual personnel costs increased 4.25%.
- Personnel fixed costs, inflation for operating and student aid, and building operating reserves would have increased total expenditures by 8.0%.
  - Actual total expenditures increased by 6.5%.



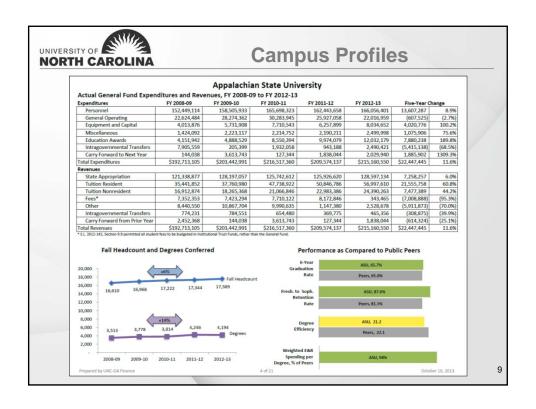
## **Orientation to Campus Profiles**

  - UNC General Administration's profile contains expenditure and revenue data only.

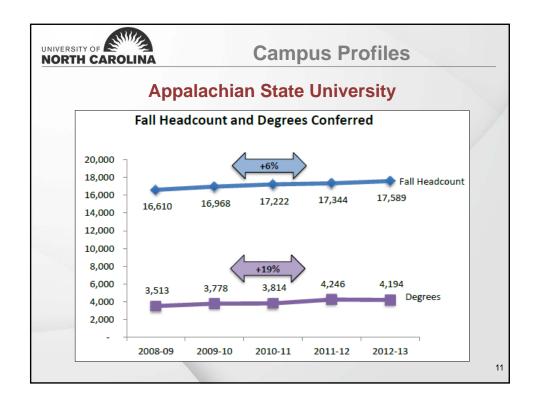


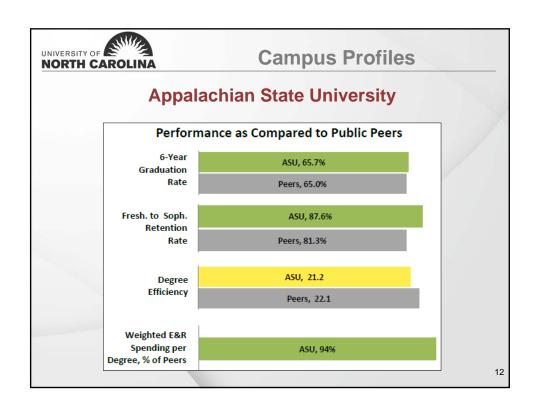

# **Campus Trends and Summary Information**

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#### **Trends and Summary Information**

#### **Trends – Expenditures and Revenues**

- Nearly all institutions increased spending over the five years (16 of 17 campuses).
- Most institutions received an increase in state appropriations (13 of 17 campuses).
- All campuses increased resident tuition receipts and most increased nonresident tuition receipts (13 of 16 campuses).
- UNC General Administration's total expenditures decreased 31%.



#### **Trends and Summary Information**

#### **Trends – Headcount and Degrees**

- System-wide, fall headcount increased 2%, but this varied by campus.
  - 10 campuses increased and 7 decreased
- Every campus increased in number of degrees conferred.

#### **Summary – Campus Performance**

# 6-Year Graduation Rate

- UNC System outperformed public 4-year institutions.
- 5 of 16 campuses outperformed peers.

Freshman-to-Sophomore Retention Rate

- UNC System outperformed public 4-year institutions.
- 7 of 16 campuses outperformed peers.

#### **Degree Efficiency**

- Public 4-year institutions outperformed the UNC System.
- 6 of 15 campuses outperformed peers.

## E&R Spending per Degree

- UNC System outperformed public 4-year institutions.
- 6 of 15 campuses outperformed peers in weighted E&R spending per degree.



#### **Summary**

Overall, General Fund expenditures have increased 6.5% in the last five years, while fixed costs and inflation would have increased expenditures by 8%.

Appropriation support has decreased as a relative share of expenditures, while tuition has increased.

All campuses have increased degree production.

Campus performance relative to peers is mixed.
