

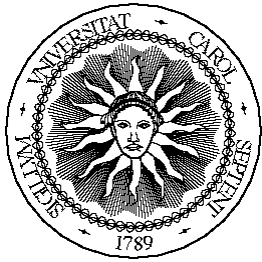
University Highlights from 2007 Legislative Session

- The University of North Carolina had one of the most successful state sessions in the country this year.
- The University received an overall 10.6% increase in operating appropriations from the General Fund, with an additional \$35 million for need-based financial aid provided from the Escheats Fund.¹
- The University began the continuation budget process with an authorized budget of \$2.4 billion and ended the session with an authorized budget of \$2.7 billion.²
- The General Assembly provided funding or authorized certificates of participation for 26 capital projects totaling \$614 million. These funds will complete 13 campus projects and will provide planning or partial funding for an additional 13 projects.
- Many of the Board of Governors' highest priorities received funding:
 - Need-based financial aid (from Escheats);
 - Funding to support approximately 1/3 of the Board's request to increase faculty salaries to the 80th percentile of campus peers;
 - UNC Online Initiative;
 - Matching funds for the first year of the Distinguished Professors Challenge Grant initiative; and
 - Summer academic bridge & student retention pilot programs.
- Additionally, the General Assembly appropriated funds to provide an average 4% merit pay increase for faculty and EPA non-faculty.
- Strong focus was placed on University research, with appropriations for:
 - Landmark funding for cancer research at UNC-CH that will increase to \$50 million annually;
 - Creation of a Research Competitiveness Fund;
 - Graduate student recruitment & retention (first new funding since 1998);
 - Research Campus at Kannapolis;
 - Support for NCSU College of Engineering; and
 - Joint program in nanosciences & nanoengineering at NC A&T and UNCG.
- All ten pieces of legislation in the University's non-budget legislative agenda were passed, including:
 - Short-term PACE recommendations implemented;
 - Privacy protection provided for admission applications;
 - UNC campuses made smoke-free;
 - UNC Hospitals allowed to make debt collection practices more patient-friendly; and
 - UNC campuses authorized to begin non-appropriated capital projects totaling \$334 million.

The University of North Carolina 2007 Legislative Agenda – Policy Recommendations

1 President's Advisory Committee on Efficiency and Effectiveness (PACE) Recommendations

The following are the PACE's legislative recommendations to find efficiencies within the University. Reflected below are the potential cost savings and cost avoidance factors for these items, which by year five could collectively total \$20 million annually. **For the savings in recurring state appropriations that are identified below, the University will reallocate dollars in lieu of other state funding to its core missions: teaching, research and public service.**

Facilities Management

- ~~Building systems efficiency improvements by modifying G.S. 133-3 and allow campuses to establish standards for building components.~~
- Increase informal limit for small construction from \$300K to \$500K.
- Raise force account limit to a single total limit of \$200K, allowing organizations to perform work in-house when more cost-effective.

Estimated Cost Savings / Avoidance

~~Estimated savings of \$300,000 in year two, increasing to \$500,000 in year five. Cost avoidance of \$100,000 in year two and \$560,000 in years three-five.~~

Other Barriers

- Elimination of duplicative or unnecessary reports including the Management Flexibility report and the Home-based Employees report and modify the Personal Services Contract report to streamline reporting procedures.

Estimated annual savings of \$300,000.

Auxiliary Services

- ~~Provide vending regulatory relief by repealing G.S. 143-64 which requires water and juice proposals be solicited separately.~~

~~Failure to address this issue could reduce contract revenue by \$1.8 million annually.~~

Construction / Leasing

- ~~Streamline construction document review processes by requiring one review by the State Construction Office and the Department of Insurance. (tentative – follow work of study committee)~~
- Modify G.S. 120-76.1(b) to allow for notification to Governmental Operations thirty (30) days prior to onset of a capital project.
- Extend leasing authority to qualified campuses, as determined by the Board of Governors.

~~Estimated average annual savings of 5% per project. Applied to system-wide capital expenditures of \$350 million, future cost avoidance is \$17.5 million.~~

Inflationary savings obtained from reduced approval time at a monthly rate of 0.6% per project.

Savings would come by reducing lengthy lease times from about 9 to 4 months.
