REMARKS OF DR. STEVEN BALLARD BOG MEETING MARCH 19, 2004

Board of Governors, President Broad, all of the ECU community, Chairman Talton, and all of those who participated in the process, Nancy and I are just tickled to be here and we especially appreciate the warm welcome and the friendliness and the spirit of community that we have seen in all of our visits here. I would just like to make two or three points before we go on to other matters. We are just thoroughly delighted, excited, thrilled, over whelmed and ready to move tomorrow. We couldn't be happier, this is a career aspiration for us and our family, but it also is a great fit between what I believe in higher education and what exists in the North Carolina system and what, especially, exists at East Carolina University. It is about our common aspirations, it is about the possibilities for both ECU and for North Carolina. My job is always to keep the gold star future in front of us and I think we're all ready to identify, find and reach those gold stars. I look forward to working with every one of you.
