Michael Tiemann
Vice President of Open Source Affairs

Michael Tiemann is a true open source software pioneer. He made his first major open source contribution more than 2 decades ago by writing the GNU C++ compiler, the first native-code C++ compiler and debugger. His early work led to the creation of leading open source technologies and the first open source business model.

In 1989, Tiemann's technical expertise and entrepreneurial spirit led him to co-found Cygnus Solutions, the first company to provide commercial support for open source software. During his 10 years at Cygnus, Tiemann contributed in a number of roles, from president to hacker, helping lead the company from fledgling start-up to an admired open

source leader.

Tiemann serves on a number of boards, including the Open Source Initiative, GNOME Foundation, and Open Source for America. Tiemann also provides financial support to organizations that further the goals of software and programmer freedom, including the Free Software Foundation and the Electronic Frontier Foundation.

Additional information:

Michael Tiemann sang professionally as a boy in the Choir of St Thomas Church in Manhattan from 1974-1978. With the choir, he recorded four albums, appeared on national television, and performed at significant events, including the National Cathedral in Washington DC as part of the 1976 bi-centennial celebration.

Tiemann graduated with the class of 1986(*) from the Moore School of Electrical Engineering at the University of Pennsylvania and began a career in software research and development in Austin Texas.

After two years of startling progress on the GNU Project, Tiemann was invited to spend a summer working for INRIA (The French National Institute of Computer Science) in Paris, and then to become a graduate student at Stanford University in Electrical Engineering.

In his first week at Stanford, Tiemann helped to change the Intellectual Property policy of the University to permit graduate students (not only professors) to freely share their work under the GNU General Public License, rather than assigning it exclusively to the University or the professors for whom they worked.

In 1989, Tiemann's technical expertise and entrepreneurial spirit led him to co-found Cygnus Solutions, the first company to provide commercial support for free and open source software. During his 10 years at

Cygnus, Tiemann contributed in a number of roles, from president to hacker, helping lead the company from fledgling start-up to an admired open source leader. In January 2000, Cygnus Solutions was acquired by Red Hat, and Tiemann became Red Hat's Chief Technical Officer. In 2004, he changed roles, becoming the company's first Vice President of Open Source Affairs

In 2006, Tiemann decided it was time to apply what he had learned from the world of open source software to music production. He founded and built Manifold Recording, a high-end, carbon neutral recording studio and production facility in Pittsboro North Carolina.

Tiemann has served on a number of boards, including the Open Source Initiative (retiring as President), GNOME Foundation, and Open Source for America. He also served on the board of the Montessori Community School (retiring as President). Presently, Tiemann participates in the Chancellor's Working Group for Entrepreneurship at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, and serves on the Board of Carolina Performing Arts.
