Brief Biography of Dr. Assad Meymandi

Dr. Meymandı is a noted psychiatrist, humanist, and philanthropist, who frequently speaks and writes on diverse topics that relate to his interests in medicine, the arts, religion, and philanthropy Dr. Meymandı earned his MD degree from George Washington University School of Medicine. In addition, he holds PhDs in both biochemistry and philosophy, and he was awarded an honorary doctorate in humanities. A longtime resident of Raleigh, he is in private practice as a psychiatrist and neurologist, and serves as Adjunct Professor of Psychiatry at UNC, Chapel Hill.

The Press has described Dr. Meymandi as "aristocratic in breeding, intellectual in temperament, and philanthropic in lifestyle. His hunger for knowledge is surpassed only by his generosity. His philanthropic activities in medicine, the arts and humanities have made his name synonymous with enlightenment."

The city of Raleigh recognized this by honoring him with the Raleigh Medal of Art in 2000, and in the fall of 2002, Governor Easley appointed him to the Board of the North Carolina Arts Council He was given the highest North Carolina civilian award, the Order of Longleaf Pine by Gov. Easley in 2004. In January 2003, he was elected to the Vestry of Christ Episcopal Church, and he has served as President of the NCSU Friends of the Library. He has endowed a Fellowship dedicated to the task of bridging the gap between the basic sciences and humanities at the National Humanities Center where he serves on the Board of Trustees Among the NHC Meymandi Fellows are Harvard Professor of Entomology, Pulitzer Prize winner and father of Sociobiology; Dr. Helen Vendler, Harvard Professor of English; Nobel Laureate Sir Paul Nurse, President of Rockefeller University and Sir Patrick Bateson, Emeritus Professor of Ethology at Cambridge University and President of the Zoological Society of London. Dr. Oliver Sacks, the world renowned neurologist is among the NHC Fall 2008 Meymandi Fellows. He has endowed professorship chairs, and gives scholarships to bright and promising medical and conservatory students.

The 1800 seat state-of-the-art Meymandi Concert Hall in Raleigh, which opened on 21 February 2001, was named by Dr. Meymandi to honor his mother. He is building 200 housing units for the survivors of the Bam disaster in Iran, where 35,000 people were killed in Jan '04. Upon completion, he will add a school and a community center.

The construction, expansion and landscaping of the Touring Exhibition Center of the NCMA named for the Doctor's father has been completed. The Meymandi gallery was opened with the "Rembrandt Exhibit in America" in October 2011. The Doctor plans to place the Meymandi memorabilia including the eighth century illuminated Quorans and books of Poetry in that space so all people of NC could enjoy them.

He has been honored with Longleaf Pine, the highest NC civilian Award, by the former NC Governor Michael Easley, and this year, he was chosen to be inducted into Raleigh Hall of Fame (October 1, 2012)

Dr. Meymandi was Founding Editor and Editor-in-Chief, *Wake County Physician* magazine, from 1996 to 2012. He retired in January 2012 as Emeritus Editor. He continues to write weekly "Monday Musing" with online distribution, and the monthly syndicated column ""Meymandi at Large" distributed by Matrix Publishing Co.

Carl V. Venters, Jr. was born in Rocky Mount, N.C. and grew up in Great Neck, N.Y. and Jacksonville N.C.

Venters graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill with a degree in Radio, TV, and Motion Pictures.

After graduation Venters served three years active duty as an officer in the U.S. Marine Corps and after active duty he retired as a Major in the Reserves. After serving in the Marines he became program director of the Chapel Hill studios of WUNC-TV.

From 1960 to 1972, Venters owned, managed, and built radio stations in Farmville, Fuquay Varina, and New Bern, N.C. After selling his stations he accepted the position of President of Durham Life Broadcasting Service in Raleigh, N.C. in 1972. The company owned WPTF-AM and WPTF-FM. Venters changed WPTF-FM to WQDR-FM, the first album rock FM station in the country. In 1978 he acquired the NBC TV station for the company, WPTF-TV CH 28. He also produced the UNC coaches television programs which included The Dean Smith program. Venters also produced the N.C. State University sports radio network.

In 1982 Venters resigned from Durham Life Broadcasting to start his own radio company, Voyager Communications. He and his partner owned and operated nine radio stations in Raleigh, Greensboro, Charlotte, Greenville, S.C., and Columbia, S.C. until they sold the group in 1994. He served as a USIA advisor to The Palestinian Broadcasting Company assisting them in building their first radio and TV stations in the West Bank in Israel. He was a lead investor in the motion picture, BANDWAGON, which was sold to a subsidiary of Paramount Pictures.

In 1997, Venters and his son-in-law, Chuck Sullivan, bought three radio stations in Wilmington, N.C. In 1999 the company, Ocean Broadcasting, LLC, bought two more radio stations.

Venters has served as President of the N.C. Association of Broadcasters, the Raleigh City Club, The Raleigh City Gallery of Contemporary Art, and The Raleigh Sales and Marketing Executives. He has served as Vice Chairman of National Association of Broadcasters, Vice President of The Raleigh Chamber of Commerce, and served on the Boards of Directors of the Capitol City Club, the UNC Alumni Association, and various civic organizations. He currently is Chairman of the North Carolina State Emergency Communications Committee, and is a member of the Board of Visitors of the UNC School of Journalism and Mass Communications. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame of the North Carolina Association of Broadcasters in 1995.
