

Friends of the University of North Carolina,

Before joining UNC General Administration in June 2012, I knew of the diverse and intellectually rich portfolio of research and sponsored program activity taking place across the University and our state. In the past year I have come to appreciate even more the breadth of what we do. This annual report provides just a brief snapshot into that activity for FY2012.

The University of North Carolina had another record year in research. Despite the challenges of the current fiscal climate, our institutions remain competitive for external funding. Institutions reported a total of \$1,296,415,578 in new awards in FY2012. When adjusted to take into account subawards made between UNC institutions and ARRA or one-time Stimulus Funds, the FY2012 total was \$1,239,547,157, which represents a 1.6% increase over FY2011.

Some sponsored awards provide UNC institutions with a portion of the costs of conducting research. The Facilities and Administrative (F&A) receipts, applied wisely, results in the kind of overall growth seen on pages four and five. Page six follows with an overview of the organizations that sponsor these activities across the University.

Without a doubt, research and sponsored programs boost local economies in North Carolina resulting in growth of the state economy as a whole. We continue to make strides in understanding this impact. For example, in FY2012 UNC Chapel Hill participated in the STAR METRICS federal initiative on research impacts and learned that their awards from federal agencies supported the equivalent of 3,063 full time positions in the second guarter of 2012 alone. And that figure does not include all of the indirect economic impacts of having those jobs in North Carolina. Also, through our continued development of REACH NC, a Web-based portal where users can access the vast research expertise and capabilities in North Carolina universities and research institutions, we are forging fruitful relationships between our faculty, business and industry, and the general public (www.reachnc.org).

Steady Progress


In FY12, UNC institutions once again demonstrated their competitiveness for sponsored programs.

As ARRA funding becomes a thing of the past, annual award dollars have trended more towards normal levels. Such trending appears again this year, with total award dollars (\$1.3B) reflecting a 5.5% decrease from FY11.

The adjusted annual total provides a better sense of base annual award levels to UNC institutions. At \$1.24B, the adjusted total shows a 1.6% growth over the adjusted total from the previous fiscal year. Excluded from the adjusted total are ARRA (Stimulus Bill) funding, which has boosted systemwide award totals since FY09, as well as any subawards made between UNC institutions.

Adjusted annual totals increased in FY12 for six institutions (ECU, NCSSM, NCSU, UNC-CH, UNCP, UNCW) and UNC GA.

Not all current-fiscal-year submissions are funded in the same fiscal year. Some current fiscal year awards are for prior fiscal year submissions.




Sponsored Programs from FY97 to FY12

In the last 16 years, UNC sponsored program activity has doubled, even without the recent boost from ARRA funds (shown in gold). A significant factor in this rapid growth is the use of facilities and administrative (F&A) receipts that are awarded to help institutions cover the costs of conducting research. UNC institutions utilize F&A receipts to, among other things, maintain and expand research infrastructure; invest in new research through matching funds, seed grants and "start up" packages for new faculty; support library holdings; and ensure compliance with federal and other regulations.

> Note: To avoid double-counting, interinstitutional subagreements are not included in Annual Awards.

Growth in Proposal Submissions

At a time when all UNC institutions are doing more with less, the role of our campus research faculty, administrators and staff has never been more critical. In recent fiscal years, the number of annual proposal submissions increased by 30% across all UNC campuses. The percentage increase in proposal submissions does not account for the additional effort required of our faculty and staff to submit ARRA proposals since 2009 and to administer those that were awarded.

Note: Inter-institutional subagreements require staff effort and are included in Annual Proposals.


