## Agenda Item 4a: Discussion of Vacancies on Councils and Boards of Trustees

**Situation:** There is a partial-term ending on February 28, 2020, on the UNC Press Board of

Governors. This vacancy results from the resignation of Sherman James of

Atlanta.

**Background:** The Press has 15 elected members who serve 5 year terms and may be

reelected for successive terms with a service limit of 3 full terms. Eleven of the current members actively hold an academic position from universities including

UNC-CH, UNC Greensboro, NCSU, and NCCU.

According to its by-laws, the Press BOG creates a nominating committee and submits a slate to the Chancellor of UNC-CH who transmits it to the UNC system

president, who presents it to the UNC Board of Governors.

Assessment: Ann Maxwell, who is the Committee on University Governance liaison to

UNC Press, has begun working with UNC Press to identify a candidate.
