UNC Academic Common Market Pilot Program

The Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) was created in 1948 as a compact for education. The purpose of SREB's interstate compact is "to provide services to member states, to create ways to share resources, and to enable states to achieve together educational programs and improvements that would be impossible or financially impractical for a single state" (SREB Services and Programs, p. 1). SREB was developed at the request of Southern leaders in business, education and government; it was the nation's first compact for education. There are 16 SREB states: Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, and West Virginia.

Over the years SREB has worked to improve every aspect of education — from early childhood education to doctoral degrees and beyond. SREB states believe that they can lead the nation in educational progress. That is the theme of the report approved by the Southern Regional Education Board in 2002. Recently, SREB members announced 12 new goals. The 2002 *Goals for Education: Challenge to Lead* declares that education in the South will seek not merely parity but leadership. *Challenge to Lead* describes a cohesive system of education extending from the cradle to a lifetime of productive citizenship.

The Academic Common Market has been in existence for almost thirty years. The 1974 Academic Common Market original compact states that "the purpose of the Academic Common Market is to share between states academic degree programs located at southern public colleges and universities. This is accomplished through an exchange of students across borders at in-state rates" (Academic Common Market: Administrative Guidelines, 2002, p. 2). The Academic Common Market (ACM) supports existing degree programs that have the capacity to serve additional students and "to provide access and encourage movement across state lines for programs not available in a student's home state" (Guidelines, p 2).

It was in the spirit of sharing resources, encouraging efficiency, and providing access to more educational opportunity for citizens that the Board of Governors endorsed participation in the Academic Common Market program of SREB. In response to the BOG request, the 2001 General Assembly ratified the establishment of a pilot program for participation in at the graduate level. Since this is a pilot project, reports to the General Assembly are due by the end of December 2003 and by the end of January 2005. Participation by UNC in the Academic Common Market past July 2005 must be ratified by the General Assembly.

The legislation established the criterion for selecting UNC programs for participation in the ACM: “select for participation only those graduate program that are likely to be unique or are not commonly available in other Southern Regional Education Board states.” The Office of the President invited UNC campuses to nominate programs for participation. Using the National Center for Education Statistics’ database, the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS), programs were reviewed using the standard of whether there were six or fewer similar degree programs available in public universities in the SREB states. That process resulted in the initial set of programs accepted for participation. Either by request from a potential student or by campus nomination, other programs are reviewed for addition to the approved inventory of participating programs. The UNC graduate programs currently included in the ACM inventory are listed in Appendix B.

Students who are residents of other SREB states and are accepted into a UNC ACM program pay in-state tuition. Likewise, residents of North Carolina who are accepted in out-of-state ACM programs pay in-state tuition for the appropriate SREB state.

In order to coordinate the University of North Carolina’s participation in the Academic Common Market, the Office of the President appointed an ACM state coordinator and a manager of the web site. UNC’s web site for the ACM was developed and continues to be hosted by Research Triangle Institute. Dr. Donna Benson was the original UNC-ACM state coordinator, and Dr. Michelle Howard-Vital serves in the position now. Morris Dean, a member of the Academic Planning staff, serves as manager of the web site.

Eleven of the sixteen constituent UNC institutions have elected to participate in the pilot program at the graduate level. Participating campuses have a coordinator to serve as campus liaison to the ACM program. Because of the graduate focus, campus coordinators are often deans of the graduate school. Campus coordinators interact with out-of-state students who want to participate in the ACM program. Additionally, campus coordinators recommend certification of students for participation in ACM, communicate with the campus’s business office regarding the tuition issues, and certify that students are progressing through the program. In order to maintain an appropriate level of participation in the ACM, campus coordinators also monitor the inventory of programs available for ACM participation, and may nominate new academic programs for inclusion in the ACM inventory. The participating UNC institutions and their campus coordinators are listed in Appendix A.

Thirty North Carolina residents have participated in graduate programs in other SREB states under the ACM. Florida is the state that has received the most North Carolinians, by far. Ten students are currently pursuing an L.L.M. degree in Taxation at the University of Florida. Five students are pursuing graduate degrees at other Florida universities. Eighteen residents from eight SREB states have participated in UNC programs under the Academic Common Market. More detailed data on NC participants are given in Appendix C, and on participants from other states in Appendix D.

The Office of the President has been concerned to maintain a balance between North Carolina residents studying as ACM participants in other SREB states and residents of

other SREB states studying as ACM participants in North Carolina. We developed a slot system that allocates four ACM slots per year per doctorate-granting institution and two slots per year per master's-granting institution. This flexible system can be expanded for a particular campus, as was done for ASU when they had more demand than slots. Yet it gives us some overall control for balancing incoming and outgoing students. North Carolina citizens were allowed to participate one semester before residents of other states so the overall balance favors NC, but for year-to-year comparison of participation both ways there is an overall balance.

This program is clearly providing opportunities both to North Carolina citizens and to citizen of other SREB states for affordable educational programs not available in their home start.
