Chairman Hans called the meeting to order.

- 1. Mr. Barringer moved, seconded by Gov. Holshouser, that the minutes of October 12, 2005 be approved. The motion carried.
- 2. Laura Foxx, Associate Vice President for Advancement provided an advancement update. She reported that unofficial fundraising total for FY 2005 shows the campuses raising \$425 million, and that the focused growth campuses raised nearly \$30 million, twice the figure from 2001. A more comprehensive update will be provided in 2006.
- 3. The committee heard a federal update from Kimrey Rhinehardt and Bob Samors. Ms. Rhinehardt informed that committee that Congress remained in session working on several appropriations bills. Also, the Higher Education Re-Authorization act will not be finalized this year, but we expect final action to occure in 2006. Bob Samors outlined for the committee the new federal agenda process and timeline. This year, the emphasis is on state-wide initiatives, particularly this that have an economic benefit to a region. The campuses will be allowed individual pages to be included in the official Board of Governors agenda. The campuses are excited about this new process.
- 4. The committee approved the 2005 State Legislative Reports, a comprehensive overview of the 2005 session of the NC General Assembly.

There being no further business, the committee adjourned.
