SUBJECT: Report on Where Top Students Go

At a previous Committee meeting, a member asked if we know where the top students in North Carolina go to college. This report is an attempt to answer that question. We understood the question to refer to high school graduates in North Carolina and how many of the top graduates went out of state. We can provide a lot of information about students if they enroll at a UNC campus, but those who never apply obviously are not in our data systems. To encompass the top public high school graduates, we went to the College Board to get a list of all NC public high school graduates who scored above 1300 on the combined SAT. We had to enlist the cooperation of the NC Department of Public Instruction to carry out the study. Once we got a list of the top students from the College Board the next step was to go to the National Clearing House to determine where those students were enrolled in college. At each step there had to be agreements and careful scrutiny of the process to assure that all requirements for protecting student privacy were met. We now have a response based on those students who graduated from a public high school in North Carolina in the class of 2005.


The information about top students is set in the context of the over all movement of freshmen in and out of North Carolina. North Carolina has one of the highest rates in the nation of accommodating its freshmen at a post secondary institution within the state.


Setting the National Context

- Postsecondary Education Opportunity reported on the migration of college freshmen, reporting a national average of 17.9% of freshmen leave their home state to attend college
- In NC only 8.9% left the State
- In overall migration, NC ranks 3rd for net positive migration in the US
- Among freshmen at 4-year public institutions NC ranks 7th in net positive migration


Emigration Rate for State Resident Freshmen, 2004




Freshmen Net Migration by State, 2004




Public 4-Year Freshmen Net Migration by State, 2004




- Top North Carolina public high school graduates were determined using a combined SAT score of 1300 or above
- With help of NC DPI and the College Board, a list of students were generated and submitted to the National Student Clearinghouse
- A total of 3569 names were submitted for the 2005 cohort. A record was returned for 3092 (86.6%) with 477 having no record (13.4%)
