NOTE: The allocations shown above were made under the State Contractual Scholarship Fund (SCSF) program to North Carolina resident undergraduate students attending private colleges and universities in North Carolina. For 1998-99, the allocation made to each institution was determined by multiplying the number of full-time equivalent North Carolina resident undergraduates enrolled by \$900.00. The funds so allocated were then granted by the institutions to their North Carolina undergraduate students on the basis of financial need. The General Assembly appropriated \$23,782,350 for the SCSF program for the 1998-99 academic year. The shortfall in the SCSF program was covered by current and past year refunds to the program and a budget transfer from the North Carolina Legislative Tuition Grant (NCLTG) program. Administration of the SCSF program which was established by the North Carolina General Assembly in 1971, was transferred to the North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority in July 1993.
