If you can't find the graduate degree program you need, have you looked in UNC's web inventory of approved academic degree programs (northcarolina.edu/programs/index.php)? Or at UNC Online (online.northcarolina.edu)? The master's or doctoral degree program you need could very well be listed there. Public education right here at home can be had by North Carolina residents at in-state tuition rates.

And there are North Carolina's private universities as well, listed at the website of North Carolina Independent Colleges & Universities (ncicu.org/member.html, where you can find a link to their publication *Handbook*, which includes a list of member institutions' degree offerings).

But if North Carolina doesn't offer the master's or doctoral degree program you need, maybe one of the other states shown offers it. If the program is not commonly available (and therefore eligible for access through the **Academic Common Market**), you might be able to pursue it at the host state's in-state tuition rate.



Below is listed a small subset of those states' **degree programs that are currently approved** for North Carolina residents (some of them are available online):

- MS in **Fire & Emergency Management Administration** (online at Oklahoma State University)
- MS in **Forensic Science** (Marshall University)
- MA in **International Commerce and Policy** (George Mason University)
- **International MBA** (University of South Carolina)
- MS in **Library and Information Studies** (online at Florida State University)
- Master of **Laws in Taxation** (University of Florida)
- Doctor of **Nursing Practice** (University of South Carolina)
- Doctor of **Nursing Practice** (online at the University of Tennessee HSC, Memphis)

All of the programs currently approved for North Carolina residents are listed on the UNC-ACM website (click "Academic Programs").
