

Financial Aid Profile

- Rapid growth in students
 - ✓ 48% of UNC system growth 2008 to 2013
 - ✓ 63% receive financial aid
 - ✓ 65% of those receiving aid receive loans
 - ✓ 45% (N=9,547) are Pell recipients
 - ✓ 71% Pell recipients with EFC = \$0 (Full Need)

TAG = UNC Charlotte's Tuition Assistance Grant



TAG replacement would require endowment of \$180 to \$200 million

- TAG reduces unmet need for freshmen from \$7,074 to \$4,672 (34%)
- TAG reduces unmet need for transfers from \$8,533 to \$6,585 (23%)
- TAG funds innovative approaches (University Professional Internship Program)
