But before he arrives, there's still work to be done. I have another eight days as interim president. We remain hard at work tackling a number of critical issues, chief among them:

- Refining our institutions' plans to deliver on their educational, research, and service missions – and to do it safely, while we are still in the midst of COVID-19
- Managing the fiscal uncertainty that we face as a result of the pandemic
- And supporting the work of the UNC System Racial Equity task force so that this process, which is so critical to the ongoing vitality and relevance of this institution, delivers tangible and actionable results
