1. Call to Order and Approval of OPEN Session Minutes (Item A-1)

Chair Williford called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m., on Wednesday, April 19, 2023.

Dr. Walker and his team provided an overview of UNC System military affairs initiatives aimed at supporting military-affiliated student enrollment and success, including awarding academic credit for military training and experience, outcomes of a digital marketing campaign focused on military learners, Green Zone and Mental Health First Aid training for staff supporting military affiliated students, and policies around military student application fees and registration.

A-2. Committee on Military and Public Affairs 2022-23 Annual Report Bart Goodson

Situation: Each standing committee submits an annual report of its activities to the University of North Carolina Board of Governors.

Background: Pursuant to Section 302 E of *The Code*, "Each standing committee shall make a written report to the Board of Governors at least annually, reviewing the work of the committee during the preceding year."

Assessment: The annual report on the activities of the Committee on Military and Public Affairs for fiscal year 2022-23 is ready for review and submission.

Action: This item requires a vote by the committee to accept the report for submission to the Board of Governors.

DUTIES AND MEMBERSHIP

The Committee on Military and Public Affairs shall assist the president in maintaining positive relationships with the governor, the North Carolina General Assembly, the United States Congress, and other governmental entities. Maintaining these relationships affects the ability of the University to carry out its mission. The committee will review and approve all state and federal policy priorities of the University, which will then be presented to elected leaders. This report summarizes the work of the committee from July 2022 through June 2023.

The committee was composed of the following Board members: Michael Williford, C. Philip Byers, J. Alex Mitchell, Jimmy D. Clark, and Wendy Murphy. Mr. Williford served as chair, Mr. Byers served as vice chair, and Mr. Mitchell served as secretary.

Chancellor Darrell Allison (Fayetteville State University), Chancellor Aswani Volety (UNC Wilmington), and Interim Chancellor Kimberly van Noort (UNC Asheville) also served on the committee.

ACTIONS

The Committee on Military and Public Affairs met independently during two regular meetings (October 2022 and April 2023) between July 1, 2022, and June 30, 2023. Throughout the year, the committee discussed major legislative action in the General Assembly and in Congress.

The October 2022 meeting provided an update on the federal budget and appropriations, as well as key legislation important to UNC System institutions.

The April 2023 meeting provided an overview of UNC System military affairs initiatives aimed at supporting military-affiliated student enrollment and success, including awarding academic credit for military training and experience.

The Committee on Military and Public Affairs also met in joint session with the Committee on Budget and Finance during three regular meetings, for a General Assembly Short Session Update (July 2022) to review and discuss the 2023-24 Budget and Legislative Proposals (January 2023 and February 2023), which covered priorities in the General Assembly to review and approve the FY 2024 UNC System Federal Priorities for the first session of the 118th Congress (February 2023). The committee voted to recommend the proposals for approval by the full Board of Governors. The full Board of Governors then voted to approve the proposals on February 23, 2023.

Budget and Appropriations

Government Shutdown Averted for Now

- Laddered Continuing Resolution (CR)
 - January 19 (four appropriations bills); **March 1 extension**
 - February 2 (eight appropriations bills); **March 8 extension**
- \$1.6 trillion topline funding agreement for FY 2024
 - \$886 billion for defense; \$773 billion for non-defense
 - Largely mirrors Fiscal Responsibility Act (last spring)
 - Most accounts level funded; slight increase/decrease
- FY 2025 Appropriations Process
 - UNC System letter from President Hans to congressional delegation

Budget and Appropriations

Specific UNC System Funding Priorities:

- UNC System Office: Campus infrastructure upgrades
- University of North Carolina Wilmington: Maritime cybersecurity
- Pathfinder Airborne: UNC System Military Affairs/Ft. Liberty

Additional Priorities

Funding Priorities

- Campus based aid programs
- HBCU/MSI programs, including NASNTI
- Student Success Grants
- Federal Research accounts

Other Issues

- The Bipartisan Workforce Pell Act

Military Equivalency System (MES) Update

Recap:

- Senate Bill 761 requires the UNC System to “*develop a uniform system of granting course credits (...) based on military training or experience*”.
- President Hans signed UNC Regulation 700.7.2[R] Awarding Credit for Military Training or Experience in May 2022.
- April 2023 (last update): Phase I nearly complete.

Phase I: Internal facing

Phase II: External facing

Military Equivalency System (MES) Update

Significant progress since April 2023:

- Completed Phase I in June 2023. Met requirements of SB761.
- Began Phase II in July 2023. Designed to meet spirit of SB761.
- Currently captures more than 4,000 military credit equivalencies.
- Developing public tool for planned Spring 2024 launch.

Military Equivalency: Phase I Executive Summary

Phase I was completed in June 2023.

Phase I Roadmap:

UNC System Office provided a base list of military equivalency rules and an Implementation Guide for implementing equivalency rules to all Institutions. Institutions entered these equivalency rules in their Student Information Systems (SIS) for military credit they have historically granted.

An advisory committee of registrars assisted the System Office:

- Addressed feedback and input from the Institutions,
- Helped to finalize the base list of equivalencies,
- Helped to finalize the implementation guide, and
- Assisted with entering equivalency rules into SIS.

Military Equivalency: Phase II Executive Summary

Phase II will be production ready by late February 2024.

Phase II Roadmap:

- Align and standardize data for public display and search
- Host webinars to demonstrate MES to campus administrators, Feb 2024
- Enter credit equivalencies from prior faculty panels, Spring 2024

Working with key stakeholders:

- Campus staff and administrators: Registrars, Transfer offices, Provosts, Military Affairs Working Group
- Student veterans: User feedback
- External partners: American Council on Education (ACE)

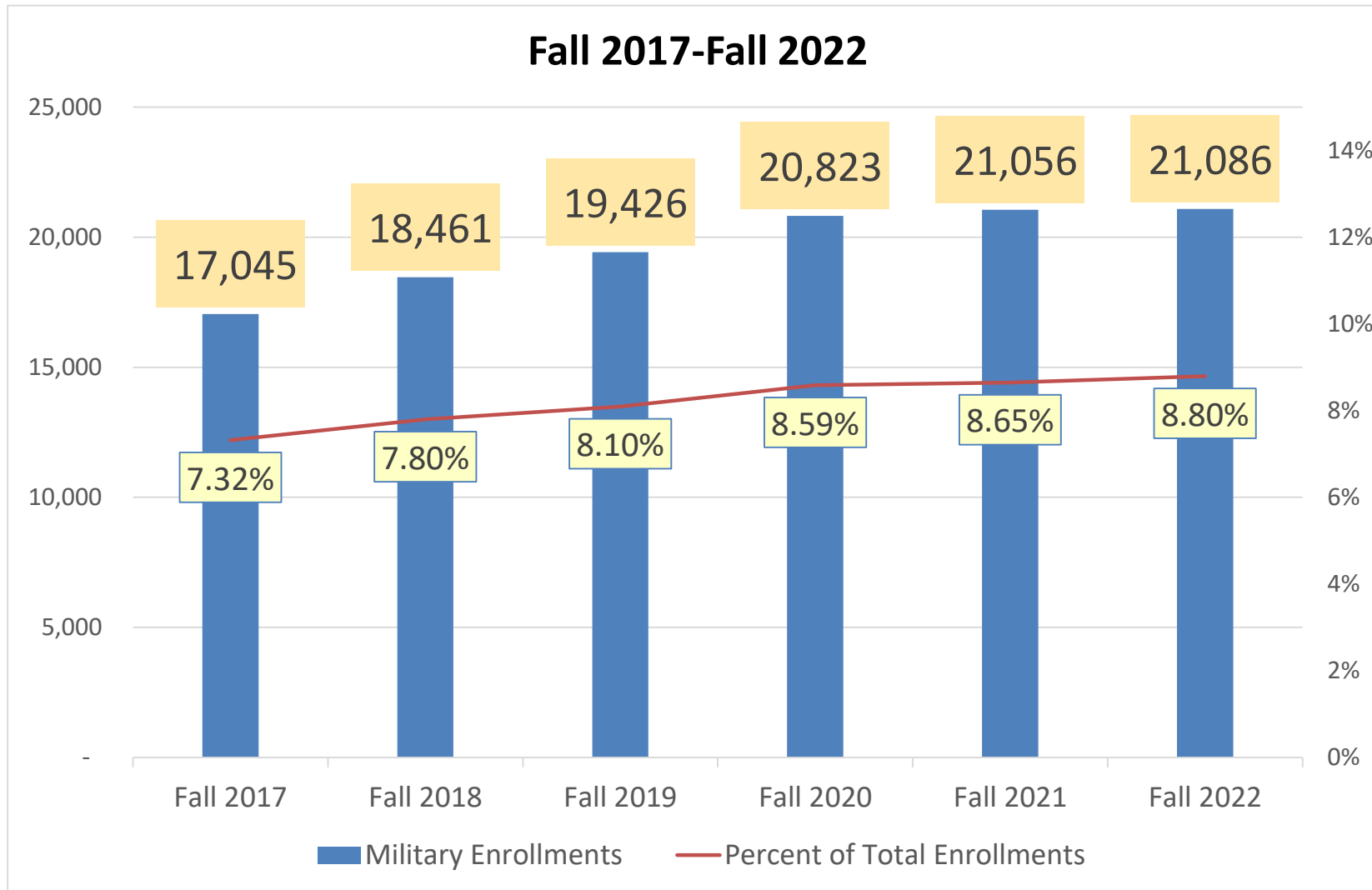

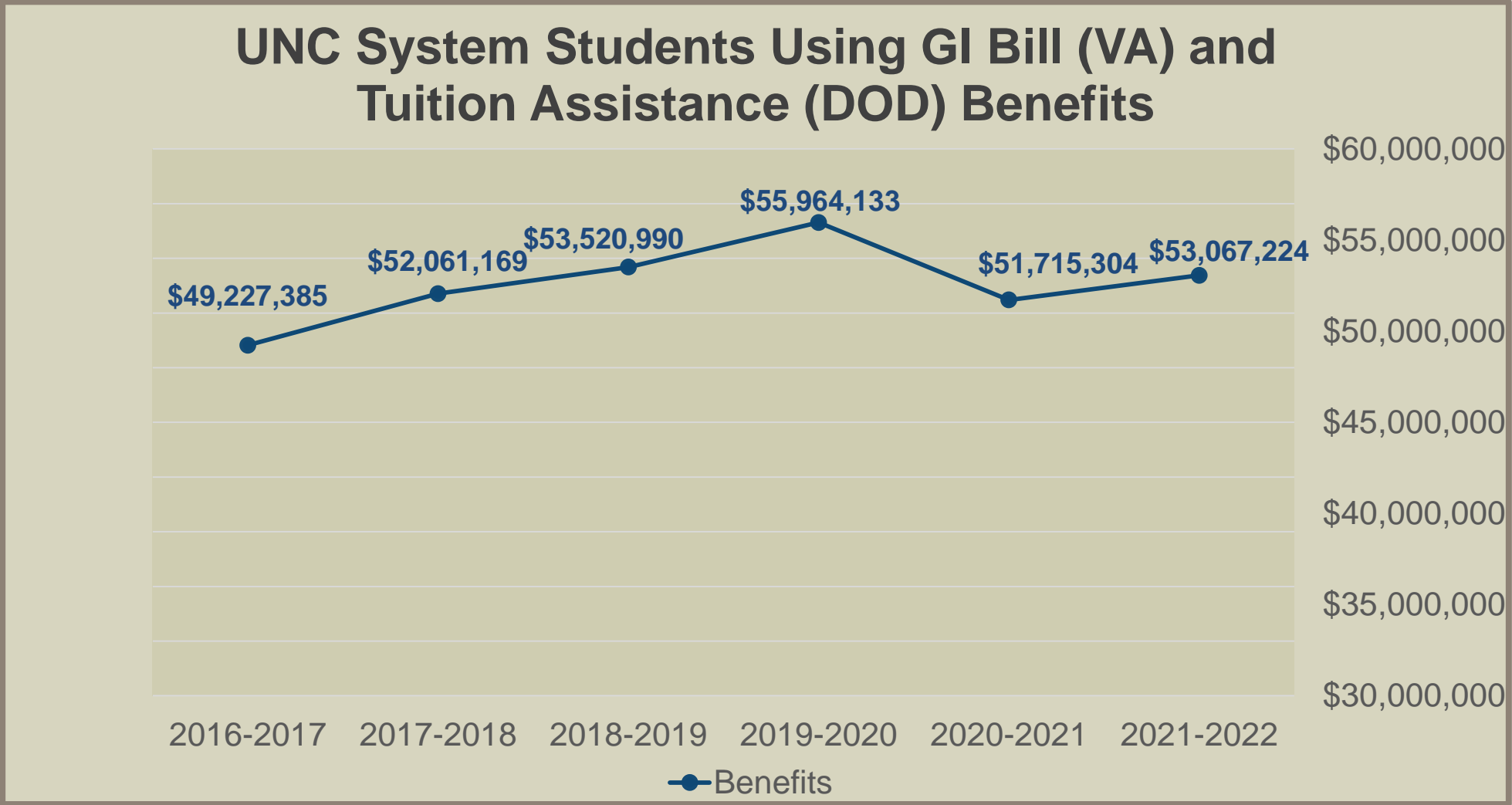
