Chancellors are requested to advise this office about pre-retirement planning programs on their respective campuses. Summaries of the information collected will be distributed to each Chancellor.

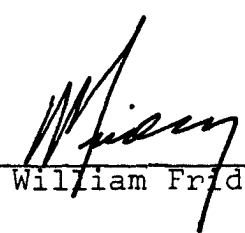
Each Chancellor should confer with his athletic director and make it clear that the University does not look with favor on further intrusions in the religious life of our region through telecasts of intercollegiate events on Sundays at hours interfering with church services. Athletic directors, in turn, should relay the message to appropriate regional and national conference officials. Please advise this office of the results of these discussions.

Other Items Discussed

1. Council members were briefed by librarians on the on-line catalog project and other improvements made possible by new communications technology.
2. R. D. McMillan reported on the series of meetings being held on block grants.

3. Felix Joyner discussed the June legislative session and budgetary matters pertaining to the 1983-85 biennium.
4. Raymond Dawson reported on the work of the task force that is conducting a study of nursing in the state.
5. Roy Carroll summarized the status of state aid to private institutions of higher learning and reported that North Carolina is providing aid to a greater number of students, more aid per student, and a greater total amount of aid annually than any other SREB state, including Texas.
6. Richard Robinson reported on the work of the ad hoc Board of Governors committee studying the issue of student representation on the Board. He also discussed the court decision in the Nova University case.
7. Chancellors were thanked for helping make the recent trustee conference a most successful one.
8. The failure of Guilford Technical Institute to achieve community college status was discussed.
