Items Discussed

1. The President reviewed the budgetary prospects in the General Assembly, with special attention to the problem of lifting the freeze on salaries.
2. Mr. Robinson reviewed the interrelationship of federal and state law concerning retirement, and Mr. McMillan discussed proposed legislation in the General Assembly on this topic.
3. Among the other bills and proposed bills discussed were these:
 - The bill to amend the escheats law so as to make all sixteen institutions eligible to share in revenue from property that escheated to the State prior to the creation of the Board of Governors.
 - The bill to require certain professors in schools of education to spend time each year teaching in the public schools.
 - Various proposals to increase out-of-state and in-state tuition.
 - A bill to delete the requirement that requests for state assistance submitted from private institutions first be presented to the Board of Governors.
 - The bill of Senator Lawing to reduce the length of the term of members of the Board of Governors to four years.
 - The bill of Representative Auman to simplify the procedure for election to the Board of Governors.
 - The bill to centralize all computing activities of state government; the President said Chancellors would be kept closely informed of developments concerning this legislation.

- The bill to prohibit the purchasing of pets from animal shelters to be used for research.
- 4. Mr. Robinson discussed with the Chancellors a number of problems that his office has observed in recent months, particularly problems having to do with the grievance procedure.
- 5. Vice President Jones discussed the proposed new policy on patents and explained that additional information was being solicited from the campuses in order to respond to inquiries raised in the Planning Committee of the Board of Governors.
