The 1984 General Assembly has appropriated \$590,000 in new funds for 1984-85 and directed The University to continue the \$160,000 of support provided for the Math-Science Education Center Network in 1983-84. Thus, \$750,000 is available in 1984-85 to continue and to expand the Network.

In order to bring the Network to its full level of funding and operation by 1985-86, it has been necessary to advance the timetable for identifying all new centers and to include all network center allocations in the budgets of designated constituent institutions in the 1984-85 budget to be considered by the Board of Governors at its meeting on July 27, 1984.

Accordingly, we have consulted with the acting network coordinator, Dr. William Smith, with other appropriate academic affairs and finance officers in The University, as well as with officials in the State Department of Public Instruction, to identify six additional centers for the network.

Criteria for identifying new centers consisted primarily of (1) the availability of existing graduate programs in mathematics and science education, (2) accessibility for teachers in need of training, and (3) assurance of statewide coverage of centers and network activities.

Based on these criteria, the following constituent institutions have been identified as locations for six new Centers with primary reponsibility for establishing educational programs as indicated.
