The Administrative Council met at 1:30 p.m. on Tuesday, October 30, 1990, in the General Administration Building.

Chancellors and Others in Attendance

All chancellors, except Chancellors Eakin, Fort, and Hackley, were present. Also present was former North Carolina Central University Chancellor Leroy Walker.

Information Reports

President Spangler introduced Chancellor Walker who serves as treasurer of the United States Olympic Committee. Chancellor Walker reviewed the events resulting in the selection of Atlanta as the site of the 1996 Olympics. He stated that his principal purpose in meeting with the chancellors was to describe a new program sponsored by the National Consortium for Academics and Sports. The program encourages academic institutions and athletic programs to take steps that will increase the likelihood that college athletes will complete their education and gain the benefits of a college education. Chancellor Walker gave each of the chancellors an information packet and indicated that he would be in touch with them to discuss the program in more detail.

Vice Presidents Joyner and Robinson discussed the progress of the University's budget and the work of the Advisory Budget Commission. Dr. Robinson stated that planning was under way to use the University's friends effectively to communicate the University's programs and needs to the legislature.

Vice President Dawson briefed the chancellors on the continuing discussions regarding EPA and SPA designation for University employees.

Vice President Memory presented copies of a newly prepared Faculty Directory of International Activities: 1990 which summarizes the international interest and language capabilities of faculty members throughout the system.

Mr. Richard Robinson announced that American Biotest Labs in California have been selected as the drug testing contractor for athletics for ten campuses and stated that the cost of the tests appeared to be very reasonable.

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The meeting adjourned at approximately 3:04 p.m.
