Chancellors who plan to be away on vacation for more than one week at a time are asked to give the President's office the name of the person who may be contacted during their absence.

Dr. West reported on the current status of the "state plan" for HEW's Office of Civil Rights. Factual data requested by HEW will be supplied promptly by this office. Chancellors were requested to file any further comments they cared to make.

Mr. Robinson reported that recent legislation governing traffic and parking vested responsibility in local Boards of Trustees, which would be wise to examine their present regulations to determine whether changes permitted under the new law would be advisable for their campuses.

Each campus is requested to supply Mr. Robinson with carbon copies of letters of transmission to HEW regarding equal employment opportunities compliance.

Chancellors are requested to wait until they hear from this office before taking any action to implement the new statute defining residency for tuition purposes. There was extended discussion of the appropriations bills enacted by 'he 1973 session. Mr. Joyner's budget instructions will be mailed to le Chancellors on Friday, June 1. These instructions are most important.

Other Items Discussed

- Consumer activities by organized student groups were discussed extensively, as was the apparent trend toward a fixed rental charge for textbooks.
- Mr. Robinson reported on the legal status of the Campus Echo case, and a lively discussion of the support for and role of campus newspapers followed.
- 3. Mr. Kennedy reported that nominees for the O. Max Gardner Award were unusually worthy candidates. He also discussed the election of members of local Boards of Trustees, and outlined plans for the orientation of new members of the Board of Governors.
- Dr. Stokes discussed developments relating to Fort Bragg programs, and outlined steps being taken to solve problems in the field of nursing.
- 5. The Council was advised that Mr. Victor Bryant's committee has begun work on Chapter 3 of the Code dealing with the permanent structure of the Board of Governors.
