



Eligibility and Requirements:

- Applicants must be a North Carolina resident as determined by the North Carolina Residency Determination Service (ncresidency.org).
- Applicants' Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) as reported on the FAFSA must be at or below \$90,000.
- Applicants must be new first-year or transfer undergraduate students entering Fall or Spring semesters and pursuing their first bachelor's degree.
- Applicants must pursue a full-time courseload of at least 15 credit hours per semester.
- Recipients must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress.


